It was helpful when I needed briefs but didn't have time to take notes myself (the pages are perforated so you can tear them out easily and make them apart of your class notebook). This book is especially good at pulling out the black letter law from the cases, which a lot of students struggle with early in law school. One thing I particularly liked about the book was that it defined terms that most people wouldn't know off the top of their head (and don't feel like googling when

they have ten other cases to read). It is a good supplement, but that is all, there is no replacement for actually reading the textbook and the cases therein.
