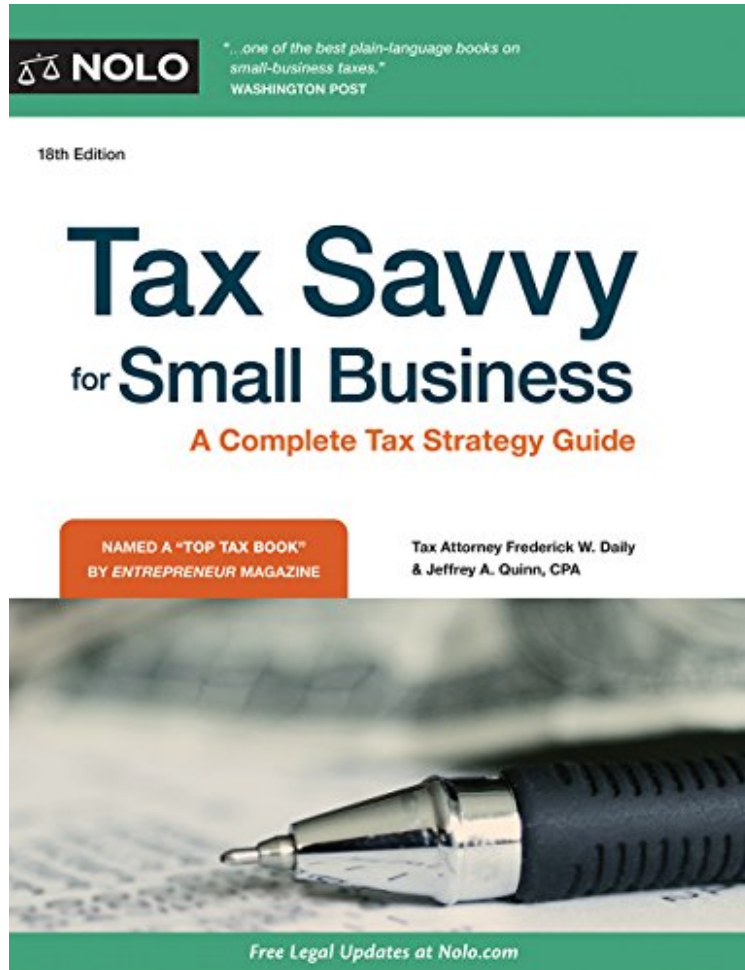

In particular, the book's coverage of selecting a business form to use such as sole proprietorship or LLC or S/C corporation is quite good. The section on business deductions including healthcare insurance benefits is great. Discussions about retirement savings plan options is also very good. In many instances, the book properly points readers to consider trade-offs so that they can make the best decision for their circumstances, which is quite reasonable given that each person's business situation differs so no "one size fits all" recommendation is possible. I am a picky reader and I was thoroughly impressed by the consistently high quality of the material presented in this book. Naturally, one book cannot answer all possible questions because financial planning is a subject that people spend a
